## Introductions

## Agenda:

How can we, as an institution, support our DAF.

- 1. Accountability circles
  - a. Idea is useful; think of it as a support group, encouragement group, that will encourage people to move forward at their own pace
  - b. This process is used in restorative justice; have also used peacekeeping circles in that context; I support it
  - c. Read the context in which our DAF mentioned them in her letter
  - d. It's not about giving answers, it's about asking questions; questions are asked by other members of the group
  - e. Format:
    - i. Group of 3-4 people
    - ii. Could focus on behavior to change or knowledge to acquire
    - iii. Not everyone has to be in the same place with respect to racial justice to go forward
    - iv. Groups could be comprised of folks who are in different stages of understanding
    - v. Each person decides on goal they want to set to move forward with RJ
    - vi. Goal should be challenging but doable
    - vii. Set interim steps to take before next meeting; make any adjustments needed, report on progress at the following meeting
    - viii. July meeting: report on final results to the whole group
  - f. First proposed cycle: April June
  - g. Skip summer since many folks are away
  - h. Possibly offer this to folks in the congregation in the fall
  - i. How does this relate? Our DAF has mentioned this as a way of getting behaviors to change.
  - j. They're an opportunity to open up to what can happen, rather than continuing on our current path; will enable great communication between us.
  - k. These meetings will happen during our RJC meeting time.
  - I. Should they be based on the public witness statement and on the things in our DAF's response?
  - m. Proposals for how to start:

- i. sign up if you want to join one; a RJC member will randomly group people; groups will be mailed out with minutes
- ii. alternative: people self-select groups
- n. Are there other groups that have done accountability groups that we can consult?
- o. This could be fun! in addition to being hard and important work
- p. This may be ongoing, not a one-time-deal.
- 2. A list of actions to take to further racial justice in Cville was attached to the minutes
- 3. Overall: our goal is for more of us to be involved in more RJ activities and be more selfaware of what we're doing? (Committee confirmed: yes, that is overall goal.)
- 4. In a previous RJ class, they did an exercise: one person says something they've been thinking, and another person challenges it, with a RJ lens;
  - a. the exercise is as valuable for the challenger because they get to experience the process of confronting things that further a culture of white supremacy
- 5. Someone has said to one of our RJC members, what is it that our DAF did to warrant that person sending that note? THAT IS NOT OKAY.
- 6. What additional skills do we need in order to be able to challenge people when they say things that further a culture of WS?
- 7. Do we need to better capture what we are already doing?
- 8. Dual goals for this committee:
  - a. Continuing the work we are already doing to address the oppression of people of color in Cville and beyond
  - b. Addressing the culture of white supremacy in TJMC-UU
- 9. Clearness councils:
  - a. One of our members has experience with them via the Quaker community
  - b. Do we have the capacity to do them?
  - c. We need more information about them.
- 10. Do we need to know our DAF better?
  - a. Ministry?
  - b. No info about it on website
  - c. Our ministry brought this idea of shared ministry to TJMC-UU
  - d. Why don't we know her better?
  - e. Is asking these questions a way of deflecting from the pain we feel about the attack?
  - f. Is asking these questions an example of white supremacy because it deflects attention away from the attack and validates what the attacker did?
- 11. We need to do these things as an obligation to our community, in addition to supporting our DAF specifically.
- 12. <u>We will do this imperfectly, and it won't happen overnight, and we aren't going to have surety about what we're doing.</u>
- 13. Homework:
  - a. Reread our DAF's response
  - b. Do more reading about clearness councils
  - c. Read what was sent out about accountability circles
